Pittsburgh boxers won the lion's share of honors at the opening of the two-day intercity amateur boxing tournament in Madison Square Garden last night, while the highly touted local boys were relegated to the background.

Including the open class a total of seventeen bouts were offered a crowd of 5,000 persons, no less than ten of the exhibitions terminating abruptly via the K. O. route.

John Hamm, of Pittsburgh, who sports the national flyweight title, performed cleverly in trouncing Matt Corbett, Boston, in the final of his class. Corbett was a willing mixer, and although several many unhappy moments, the champion, made a sizzling light of it all the way.

Hamm has a great pair of arms and he reached the Boston boy's face and mid-section with powerful punches. They flared each other throughout the entire three rounds, but the Pittsburgher was never in danger of losing the decision.

Dan Garten, Philadelphia, the 126-pound national champion, showed improved form in the final and made Joe Morrello, Boston, quit in the second round. Morrello was a spectacle as he left the ring. There was hardly a square inch of his face which was not covered with blood.

Pittsburgh scored again in the final of the 147-pound class, when Jack Rovesti beat Charlie Hahn, a local boxer in a thrilling slugfest. Hahn packs a man's size wallop in either hand. He landed often enough to give Rovesti many unhappy moments, but Jack weathered several storms and in the final round had Hahn on the verge of a knock-out.

Rovesti was by his ability to shake off the hard ones, but he was far more scientific than his opponent, often dancing out of danger. Hahn was all in when the final bell rang.
