Prosecutor Urges County Reward in Brunen Murder Important Clues Exhausted, but Police Are Not as Far as Sea as Supposed

RIVERSIDE, N. J., March 17.—Following elimination to-night by county authorities of all tangible clues in connection with the murder of John T. Brunen, circus owner, at his home here a week ago, Prosecutor Kelsey asked the Board of Freeholders of Burlington County to offer reward for apprehension of the person or persons guilty of the crime.

George L. Werner, a former chief of the Brunen circus who had been sought for more than a week, was found yesterday and questioned. Carl Ward, an announcer formerly employed with the show, was also questioned. It was admitted by Prosecutor Kelsey after the questioning that both men had given satisfactory accounts of their whereabouts on the day of the killing. Neither appeared able to throw any light on the tragedy.
