Government Asked To Increase Force At Brooklyn Yard

Board of Estimate Calls for Steady Employment on Naval Work, on Motion of Mayor Hylan

On motion of Mayor Hylan the Board of Estimate at its meeting yesterday adopted a resolution calling upon the Federal government to keep the Brooklyn navy yard open and maintain or increase its present working force.

The Mayor was authorized to appoint a committee to cooperate with all available forces in carrying out the purposes and objects of this resolution.

The resolution also requested the Federal government to spend at least part of the \$17,000,000 appropriated for hospitalizing unemployed workers in the city and state of New York, in order to furnish additional means of employment and to provide for disabled veterans who belong in this district.

The resolution pointed out that the city had authorized work and made available about \$27,000,000 for construction of public buildings, schools, pavements, sewers, transit, etc., and would make available before the end of the year \$30,000,000 more for public works.

Following out its purpose to provide work for the unemployed, the board also approved the report of the committee of the whole providing appropriations for revenue producing improvements to the amount of \$4,470,000 for non-revenue producing improvements of \$11,891,105.

The board also approved the contract, plans and estimates of cost—\$27,000,000 for the improvement of the fire alarm telegraph system in East New York, Park Slope and South Brooklyn, and \$112,000 for the equipment of a new fire alarm central station in the Bronx.

The report of the special committee with respect to the request of Borough President Matthew J. Cahill of Richmond for an appropriation to meet the cost of construction of the freight and passenger tunnel from State Island to Brooklyn was referred to the committee of the whole.

The committee estimates that the total cost of the tunnel will not exceed \$60,000,000, and if advanced (temporarily) it can be completed in 1923. Under the program \$27,000,000 should be provided at once, with additional appropriations as follows: \$15,000,000 in 1923, \$9,000,000 in 1924, \$3,000,000 in 1925, \$2,000,000 in 1926 and \$4,000,000 in 1927.
