

Rathenau's Death Sends Mark to New Low Level

The assassination of Dr. Rathenau stimulated heavy selling of bills on the European centers in the foreign exchange and German marks declined to the lowest level ever quoted—28 1/2 hundredths of a cent. At the close yesterday, one cent would buy almost four marks. The closing quotation was 28 1/2 hundredths of a cent, compared with 30 the previous day, and 1.39 a year ago. The mint parity is 23.8 cents, and, when resumption of trading in German marks was made in 1919, the first quotation was 8 cents a mark.
