Talk of German Revolution Resented in Paris as Ammunition for Berlin

PARIS, Aug. 4.—Two days before Premier Poincaré's departure for the conference of the Allied premiers in London "Le Temps" publishes an article, certainly inspired by the government, which confirms the main lines of the French program as published in "The Tribune" eight days ago.

"Le Temps" says: "If France in the future should use part of the German payments to settle the debt to England she would do the same for the other Allies." The article is a direct attack on the pessimism already felt, toward the London meeting. The most criticized sentence in Lloyd George's declaration is where he says if the Allies are too hard on Germany they will revert to communism or be entirely reactionary.

The impression here is that the English Premier is assisting German bad faith and giving the German government an argument similar to those used by the Russian Soviets. It is pointed out that the danger of Russian aggression was emphasized and that this has never materialized.

One idea advanced regarding the British policy is that a plan will be adopted cancelling the European debt regardless of Britain's own debt to the United States, but that the work of carrying out this program will be transferred to other hands to be taken by an appeal to the people.

Plea to American Idealism Balfour's note has aroused a discussion in the English weeklies as keen as that which has been going on in the dailies. "The Spectator" finds it far too subtle for the simple matter with which it deals, and complains that it is aimed at the American government.

This journal is of opinion that the only way to move America to a large-scaled policy is to mist her idealism; in other words, "The Spectator" and "Great Britain" could agree to remit French debts on condition that France think much indignation would remain in Washington to press us for our dues."

On the left wing of the nationalists' advance they have taken several towns south of Waterford and the insurgents are retreating to the mountains in the west. It is becoming doubtful whether the irregulars will be able to make a stand in Cork in view of the rapidity with which they are being driven southward by the Free State advance.
