Rose Courten-Reed, contralto, of Portland, Ore., one of the best known concert and oratorio singers in the Northwest, now in New York on a visit, was chatting the other day on musical topics in general, when she said, in answer to a question: "What has impressed me as much as any other one thing about New York is the widespread understanding of music even among those who might be termed, for lack of a better word, 'musical'."
