At the announcement that Mussolini was officially entrusted with the formation of a ministry, immediately caused all agitation to subside. Military authorities revoked all prohibitions issued yesterday, and the Fascist, during the night had occupied the city. The King, who showed intense emotion, and the King's wife, much moved. He embraced Di Vecchi, declaring it as if he believed in observing the Italian constitution he would have gladly accepted the office, but to-morrow may be too late.
