

On a successful election, which takes place next month, will bring out a much larger vote than was polled in this city on Tuesday last. The names to be elected are a Mayor, eight Aldermen, twenty-four Councilmen, Ward Comptrolers, and school officers. The contest for Aldermen and Councilmen will be sharp, but the chief interest will center upon the Mayorship. It is true that there are rumors of a probable compromise between Mr. FERRANDO and some of the leading spirits of the Tammany Organization. BRADY has been talked of, and, within a few days, strong hopes have been expressed that he can be induced to become a candidate. If Mr. BRADY should consent to accept the Tammany nomination, Mr. Wood might "hang up his saddle" and retire again to the bosom of his family. Mr. HAYMEYER is also spoken of, but his acceptance of a nomination is very doubtful.

If there were no right spirit among our citizens, they could not and would not defend all the plans and plottings of the political leaders, by sailing in opposition to the policy of spoliation and corrupt parties who use the machinery of government to plunder the city. But the right spirit does prevail, and we despair of any genuine movement to secure the election of good men to municipal offices, until the people have learned to despise more demagogues and to act in politics, as they would in business matters—intelligently and independently, for the protection and promotion of their own interests.

Great Smith's Insanity. The report published yesterday of GERRIT SMITH'S insanity, was received by many with a degree of incredulity. They suspected that it was a ruse suggested by his alleged complicity with Rowan's proceedings at Harper's Ferry. The report, however, is fully confirmed, and the Utica Herald states that the symptoms of insanity of so marked a character that an attendant kept day and night, and that he prevented his doing violence to himself, and has exhibited a disposition to commit suicide.

It is further stated that Mr. SMITH has a hereditary predisposition to insanity. His father, though possessed of an immense estate, was subjected to fits of mental depression, during which he imagined that he was threatened with want, and would die a beggar. It is also said that GERRIT SMITH'S brother, PETER SMITH, now deceased, was for some time, an inmate of a lunatic asylum. It is further stated that the Harper's Ferry affair greatly disturbed Mr. SMITH'S mind, and that the agitation developed the sad disease, which he now suffers. He has lost all his children but one, the wife of Col. MILLAN, of Peterboro.
