GREAT FIRE IN JERSEY CITY.

EIGHTY THOUSAND SQUARE FEET OF FLAME.

An Extensive Tobacco Warehouse and a Packing Shop, with a New Warehouse Escape of Whole Blocks of Tenements. Doubtless the attention of nearly every person abroad in New Jersey last evening was attracted by a brilliant illumination of the heavens, which those on the east side thought was from a fire on the west side of the town. Along the Hudson River front the fire was seen to be near the boundary line between Jersey City and Hoboken. The flames lighted up the buildings on the river front, and made bright paths across the water from whatever point the spectator looked upon it. The flames lighted up the skies for miles around, bringing out in bold relief the masts of the shipping on the Jersey shore, and making plainly visible the various cranes flying the river. On many wharves on this side multitudes congregated to witness the conflagration, and on the ferry boats passengers thronged the bow to look at the vast sheet of flame, which was topped by gigantic masses of rolling smoke.

A THIRD FIRE IN BOSTON.
