The New York Assembly will be two hundred years old in 1883. The first organization was ordered by the English colonial Governor (Donnan) Sept. 13, 1683.

The first meeting was Oct. 17, 1683. From that time, during all the English occupation, the Assembly, frequently renewed by special elections, stood opposed to the Crown and the sometimes arbitrary Governors.
