JOHN SHERMAN'S BLOODY SHIRT RESOLUTION IN THE SENATE.

Democratic Senators Ready to Arrive the Government for Corruption and Sectionalism--Senator Lamar Says the Issue is Government Reform, Not Free Trade.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24.--There is a prospect of a fierce partisan debate in the Senate tomorrow. A day and a night before that it will introduce a resolution ostensibly designed to save the way for information about the recent political difficulties in Danville, Va., and in Mississippi, which resulted in bloodshed.

Some of the Southern Senators are very glad of the opportunity of meeting the issue. They propose to arraign the Government for administrative corruption and for the way in which it has been managed in Virginia and Mississippi that made collision between the whites and blacks inevitable.
