HAIFA, Sept. 15.—When I last visited Jericho, six years ago, it consisted of a miserable village of mud huts, containing a population of mixed negroes and Bedonins, amounting to about 300 souls.

While sitting by the fountain one afternoon I was visited by an Arab carrying a man on a litter. This excited our doctor's curiosity, and we immediately halted the procession.
