


TAKING BABY'S PICTURE.


TABLETTA PARSONS MULLINS AND SNEY.

This picture reproduces the first photograph that the young man from Tus Sus was taken. Almost any sensible being would be satisfied and happy to be mistaken for a baby in that picture.




This is a romantic name for a baby; but it gives the reader no idea of the amount of romance there really is in that baby's soul.





WILDcats IN TERROR BY A GANG.
