THE JURY BRING IN A VERDICT OF GUILTY AT MIDNIGHT.

LITTLE VALLEY, N. Y., March 13.—The trial of Mrs. Mary Wileman for murdering her husband by poisoning came to an end early this morning with a verdict of guilty of murder in the first degree. The woman was thereupon sentenced to be hanged on April 30.

The closing scenes of the trial began yesterday afternoon, when Mrs. Wileman, counsel for her husband, summed up her case. He argued that there was too much doubt to warrant the jury in sending her to the gallows.
