BREITEN, Jan. 5.—The official gazette publishes this letter from Emperor William to Crown Prince Frederick William: 'The army knows how dear it has always been to my heart. LOSSES BY FIRE.

THE INTER-STATE COMMERCE BILL.

Senator Ely's Bill Opposes It Because It Violates the Treaty of Washington.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 5.—The latest point suggested in connection with the Inter-State Commerce Bill is that it will be opposed by Senator Ely on the ground that it violates the Treaty of Washington. The point is not a new one. The thirteenth section of the treaty of Washington conferred upon the Dominion of Canada the right to transport goods through transportation in bond, in exchange for the right of transit for United States vessels through the Canadian canal. It is claimed that the bill in question violates these provisions of the treaty. Members of the Senate have expressed their opinion that it is a matter of great importance whether the bill should be passed. It is expected that the bill will be passed in the near future.
