Democracy Against Boss Rule.

Young Mr. De LANCEY NICOLL is neither a Republican nor a Democrat. He is not an Irving Hall man, a Mugwump, or an Independent Citizen. He is anything and everything which he thinks will help him into the office which his vanity covets.

In the present canvass Mr. De LANCEY NICOLL represents boss rule of the worst sort. He is the creature and candidate of a small syndicate of adventurers and liars who aspire to political power. They are bosses because they boss Mr. NICOLL; but they want to boss the town. They seized upon him originally because he was young, inexperienced, and already turgid with an unwarranted sense of importance. They pumped adulation into him until it went to his head. They sent him to the United Democracy, asking a nomination for District Attorney, and when the united Democracy chose an able and more experienced man instead, they persuaded him to sell himself outright to the enemy. The PLATT Republicans, seeing some small chance of advantage in the situation, accepted him as their own candidate, with a grin. Then, with unparalleled effrontery, the mercenary who had plotted to use NICOLL for the overthrow of the Democratic cause began their campaign of cruel slander against the honest man whom the united Democracy had preferred to the JUDAS PULTIZER candidate. They insulted the intelligence of the great mass of citizens by pretending to assume that young Mr. De LANCEY NICOLL was the District Attorney's office—MARTINE, FELLOWS, SIMPSE, and all the rest of the public servants who have so well served the public interests, wrapped in this. They insulted common intelligence, furthermore, by pretending to assume that no man but NICOLL could carry on the work begun by Mr. MARTINE, and that every person who hesitated to believe it was a friend of the hoodlums, anxious to see their crimes go unpunished.

This is the plan of campaign adopted by the bosses who boss Mr. De LANCEY NICOLL and want to boss the District Attorney's office for the next three years.

Combinations for selfish, mercenary, or dishonest purposes can make headway against Democracy only until it rises in its might and crushes them out. Democracy is unalterably opposed to Boss power and Ring rule, this year and every other year. Col. FELLOWS is the candidate of Democracy as against Ring dictation. He did not seek the nomination. It came to him unasked and unexpected, and yet a fitter choice was never made. He has pronounced no policy upon his own services to the city; and yet to compare his share in the conviction of the convicted hoodlums with that of Mr. NICOLL is almost like weighing a cloister argument of DANIEL WEBSTER against the law service of the lawyer's clerk who ran after the witness.

Col. FELLOWS has not sold himself. When elected as District Attorney he will be his own master. There is no collar around his neck, and he has not, like Mr. De LANCEY NICOLL, forfeited the support of one great party and the respect of the other.

Big Guns for New Ships.

Another important step has just been taken by Secretary WHITNEY toward giving the country an efficient navy. The first of the new high power, 10-inch steel breechloading rifles, having been completed at the Washington Ordnance yard, has been sent to the Annapolis proving grounds for trial. Of these guns and of the 10 1/2-inch, which will probably be the next calibre tested, vessels now under construction or consideration will require twenty-six. The double-turret monitors Miantonomoh, Amphitrite, Monadnock, and Terror will each carry four 10-inch guns, as will also the armored cruiser, now building at San Francisco, while the unarmored Charleston, now building at San Francisco, will have two. The double-turret Puritan will probably need four 10 1/2-inch guns. The armored battle ships will carry two 12-inch guns; but these have not yet been begun. The 10-inch piece now to be mounted and tried at Annapolis, with its muzzle still at the Washington yard, will be forwarded to the monitors, which will be forward turret in place, while work will be pushed on the after one.

The 10-inch gun is the largest steel gun ever built in America, and will be the largest and most powerful ever carried on an American war vessel. The 8-inch rifle of the Atlanta and the Boston weighs 23,000 pounds, and its carriage 14,000. The 10-inch weighs 32,240 pounds, and its carriage 22,432. The difference is still more marked in the relative work accomplished. While the 8-inch gun, with its charge of 122 pounds of powder, throws a projectile weighing 260 pounds with a muzzle velocity reckoned as 7,280 feet per second, the 10-inch is to take a charge of 250 pounds, and to throw a 600-pound projectile with a muzzle velocity of 15,280 feet per second. The very high initial velocity of the 10-inch gun is expected to be increased in the 10 1/2-inch; and while the former can penetrate 18 inches of wrought iron, the latter will penetrate nearly 24. Both of the first 10-inch guns made were disabled by accidents in the later processes of manufacture, but the transfer of one of them to the trial ground indicates that the mishap in its case has been repaired.

To get a further relative idea of the power of this new naval weapon, it may be noted that it weighs over five times as much as the 6-inch steel breechloader with which so many of our vessels have been armed, taken five times as large a service charge, and proved five times as large a projectile with six times the muzzle energy, penetrating wrought-iron armor more than ten inches deeper.

The 10 1/2-inch gun will probably weigh 32,000 pounds, and carry a projectile of 550 pounds, with a powder charge of 275. But a much greater step will be taken in building the 12-inch gun for the line-of-battle ships and the harbor defence vessels. This will weigh 44 tons, and its powder charge will be 425 pounds, propelling a projectile of 850 pounds, with a muzzle energy of nearly 20,000 foot-tons, through 27 1/2 inches of wrought iron. It is true that these results are far surpassed by the ordnance made abroad by the huge Italian ironclads like the Lepanto and the Diado, the Lauria, and the Duke, or for the French Equinox and

Calman and the English Benbow. But they will be a great advance for the American navy, and the batteries will be very heavy in proportion to the size of the vessels that carry them.

It will soon be practicable to provide the material for steel guns of all calibres from American works. The present 10-inch gun, like so many of its foreign predecessors, was made from a smaller forgings; but under the supervision of Col. FELLOWS's character, and see the folly of attacking it. The Public Schools of England. We published yesterday a very interesting letter from a London correspondent on the British public schools, which, it appears, are organized and supported on a very different plan from that of this country.

It was not until 1870 that any public provision for education was made in England, and then the aid of the State was extended to elementary education only. This aid, too, is only partial, for the public schools are not wholly maintained, as in the United States, by general taxation of the communities, but only by the sums obtained from fees paid by the pupils, taxation of Parliamentary grants. In this sense of the Education act of 1870, moreover, every elementary school is a public school, provided that it is conducted according to the conditions of the act, which especially require that there shall be no absolute exactions in the matter of religious observance and instruction.

The fee of the pupil varies between two cents and eighteen cents a week, and if he is in actual destitution the sum must be paid by the Guardians of the Poor of the district; but the principal support of the Board schools, as distinguished from the voluntary schools entitled to share in the benefits of the school fund, comes from taxation, at whose increase this year there was much growing of fear among the taxpayers. Finally, education is children between the ages of 5 and 14, in reading, writing, and arithmetic, is made compulsory, though, because of the fee exacted and the desire to use the wages of children, the requirement is very extensively evaded.

The number of pupils enrolled last year was about 4,500,000, and the average attendance about 3,500,000. The average salary of a master in a school is \$700, and of a school mistress \$375, with a higher stipend for London. Corporal punishment can be administered, but only by the head teacher, and, as with us, the girls are quicker than the boys at learning. Our correspondent, who speaks very intelligently of the results obtained by the schools of other countries, speaks in especial commendation of the penmanship of the pupils, which, among the girls more particularly, he says is the best he has seen anywhere. In this matter of penmanship, by the way, both the English and the Irish are very much superior to our own people. There must be something wrong in the instruction in the art provided in our schools, for the chirography of our average American, whatever his age or education, is bad.

So far as the method of supporting the schools is concerned, we may have nothing to learn from England, but its theory that the State should give support to elementary education only is unquestionably sound. It is for that instruction which is not to be taken about as a matter of course, but which the State can be justified, in England, where the suffrage is now greatly extended, and in this country, where it is universal, the well-being of the State demands that children shall be taught to read and write and cipher, but it is not justifiable to tax the people for any education beyond that.
