A Million in Tenement Houses.
Major Willard Bullard, Chief Sanitary In-
spector, handed to the Board of Health yesterday his
report of the semi-annual inspection of the tenements.
There are 11,524 tenement houses of which 2,200 are
rented. The tenements are occupied by 200,112
families representing 1,014,385 individuals. Complaints
were made to the Board against the sanitary condition
of 2,231 of the houses—or, perhaps, 22,521 complaints.
