THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL, HAILED OVER THE COALS IN THE COMMONS.

Many Disrespectful Questions Fired at Him—His Weak Replies to a Broadside of Invektive—The Times' Editor Looks On.

LONDON, March 22.—In the House of Commons to-day Sir William Vernon Harcourt, speaking in the discussion of the Foreign Commission, declared that Attorney-General Webster's identification with the Commission had destroyed the impression that the Government would be impartial and had added weight to the Times' charges. If the Attorney-General had not advised the Government, [Parliament would have] been a different matter. He had not performed. He condemned the Attorney-General's apology for the Harcourt charges as mean, contemptible and disgraceful, and expressed the hope that he would make a better apology.

Attorney-General Webster replied that but for the duty he owed those who trusted him he would not have noticed the charges made by Sir William Vernon Harcourt. He was unable of the notice invited to him. He would not be disgraced by the English. It is impossible whether he had been right or wrong in assuming the duty of the Harcourt. It was doubtful whether he had been prudent.
