THE DEMOCRATIC MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE IN CAUCUS.

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WASHINGTON, Jan. 24.—The Democratic members of the House were in caucus for two hours to-night, with Mr. Holman of Indiana in the chair.

There will be no row between the President and the Senate over the Illinois appointments after all. Senator Farwell has been made to see the wisdom of withdrawing his opposition to the nomination of John M. Clark to be Collector of Customs at Chicago and to-night he announced that he will offer no objection to his confirmation.

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AN ACTRESS'S SAD DEATH.

FALLING DEAD INTO HER HUSBAND'S ARMS, SHOT BY HER OWN HAND.

Mrs. Jessie Dean Reynolds killed herself in a small, prettily furnished bedroom in the brown-stone apartment house at 948 Ninth avenue, near Fifty-ninth street, Mrs. Jessie Dean Reynolds, a young mother, formerly an actress, shot herself through the heart shortly after midnight of Thursday.
