

CLEVELAND RE-ELECTED.

NEW JERSEY CITY REPUBLICANS ELECT FIVE ALDERMEN.

Result of the Election Held After the Exposure of the Big Frauds—A Heavy Vote in All the Districts.

The charter election in Jersey City yesterday resulted in another victory for Mayor Orestes Cleveland. He was re-elected Mayor for the sixth time by a majority of about 1,600 over George L. Perkins, the Republican candidate.

The total vote in the city was 28,347, about 2,000 more than was polled at the last spring election, and 5,000 less than was polled last fall. The vote was unusually large for a spring election.

The excitement in some precincts was very great. In others the election officers say the weather, as usual on spring elections, was favorable to the Democrats.

There was a good deal of trouble with the patent boxes. A good many of them didn't work, and City Marshal Long and City Clerk Scott kept moving about in carriages all day.

The return by districts is as follows: First District (complete)—Cleveland, 2,457; Perkins, 910. Cleveland's majority, 1,547.

Second District (complete)—Cleveland, 1,939; Perkins, 577. Cleveland's majority, 1,362.

Third District (complete)—Cleveland, 1,672; Perkins, 1,894. Perkins' majority, 222.

Fourth District (complete)—Cleveland, 2,073; Perkins, 2,148. Perkins' majority, 75.

Fifth District (complete)—Cleveland, 1,143; Perkins, 2,134.

Sixth District (no precinct missing)—Cleveland, 2,701; Perkins, 2,634.

The missing precincts will give Cleveland at least 1,600 majority.

The fight for Aldermen in the various districts was particularly hot. In the First District, Alderman and City Collector Patrick N. O'Neill was the Democratic candidate.

In the Second District, the old Hibernian, who was a three-cornered fight, Patrick Norton, a union keeper, Democrat, and James J. McArthur, who was defeated for the place by Alderman Keegan last spring.

In the Fifth of the six of the out-thrown order, Alderman Van Horn's death made it necessary to elect a new member.
