THE DUTCH PARLIAMENT TOLD THAT THE KING IS UNFIT TO REIGN.

German Socialists Say They Will Try to Win by Legal Means—An Episode of the Netherlands.

THE KING, Oct. 14.—The Prime Minister today informed Parliament that after the Ministers of Justice and the Minister of the Colonies had had a conference yesterday, with the doctors attending the King the question had been submitted to the Cabinet whether measures should be taken forthwith to provide for the conduct of public affairs.

At the conference it was decided that the abdication of the King was such that he was unfit to reign. The Prime Minister in making the announcement expressed his grief at the condition of his Majesty and his sympathy with him in his illness.

AMSTERDAM, Oct. 14.—A meeting of Socialists was held here today to discuss a manifesto issued by an auditor named Tindal, formerly an officer in the Dutch army, regarding the national defenses. The King recently refused an audience to Tindal, who thereupon charged the Ministry with violation of the King's rights. The King, it is said, refused to receive Tindal, although he was present at today's meeting and made a speech in which he demanded the establishment of a permanent committee of inquiry into the effect that the interests of the Crown had lost prestige was adopted.

MRS. BOOTH'S FUNERAL.

Remarkable Outpouring of Salvatistas to Honor Her Memory.

LONDON, Oct. 14.—The funeral of Mrs. Catherine Booth, wife of Gen. Booth, who was known as the "Mother of the Salvation Army," took place today at the Grosvenor Chapel, a great demonstration by that organization. The weather was exceedingly disagreeable, a fog enveloping the city, but despite this thousands of persons assembled in the streets to witness the funeral procession. The route from the Thames Embankment, where the Army mustered, to Abney Park Cemetery, where the remains were interred, lay through London's most populated district of St. Pancras. The cortege was lined with crowds of spectators, and the windows of the houses were thronged by the occupants and their friends, all anxious to witness the last demonstration of love and respect paid to their leader by the devoted ranks of the Army.

When the procession had entered the cemetery the gun carriage on which the coffin and the casket of the body were placed, and the coffin was carried by officers of the Army and tenderly lowered into the earth. The Rev. Canon H. H. Hall, the officiating minister, read the burial service. Officers of the Army from various parts of the world, including the United States, the Continent, and Asia, delivered orations.

The railroads entering London ran excursion trains, and the throng in the city was augmented by immense numbers of Salvatistas and their families. The streets were lined with people, and the air was filled with the sound of music. The members of the Army, in their uniform, were everywhere, and the badge of mourning, worn everywhere conspicuous in the crowded streets.

There were five bands in the line. All those who took part in the procession were officers of the Army, and their wives and their friends not being allowed to march.

THE NAVY DEPARTMENT TO EXAMINE ALL THE SOURCES OF SUPPLY IN THE WORLD.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14.—The Secretary of the Navy has decided upon a plan to procure nickel for use in the armor plating of the new war ships. The results of the armor tests at Annapolis, already fully set forth in these dispatches, determined the necessity of the use of steel with a nickel alloy, and Congress readily recognized the necessity of prompt action by appropriating \$5,000,000 for the purchase of nickel, to be utilized in such manner as the ordnance experts might decide. Inquiry by the department demonstrates the fact that there are not about a dozen nickel mines in the world, and only two on this continent. The output of these mines is doubtful, and it may be that one source will not be sufficient. The development among naval powers a desire to secure control of a supply of nickel, destined as it is to form so potent a factor in the armament of war ships.

Lendrum of 96 Broadway. Lendrum charges that he entrusted to Littlefield a bond of the same amount for the purpose of securing the return of the money.

The United States Court at New York has failed to return it on any part of the proceeds. The indictment is filed in the General Sessions, and Littlefield, who is locked up in the Tombs in default of \$7,500 bail on Mrs. Stephens' charge, will probably be called to the bar to answer to the new indictment.

Dr. Meredith Clifton and lawyer Gilbert M. Spear, Jr., who were the associates of Dr. Fleming upon the lunacy commission, filed their bills with Clerk Sparks of the General Sessions just after the report of the commission dedicating the amount in question to the benefit of Mrs. Stephens. Each charges \$500 for his services. Though their bills have been filed for a month and a half, Dr. Fleming has not paid a cent.

THE ANDOVER HERREY CASE.

Prof. Smyth's Appeal Comes Up in the Supreme Court of Massachusetts.
