The work of disarming the stiletto and pistol bearing residents of this city has been going forward in a satisfactory way within the past few days.

It began on Thursday, when there was a disturbance of the peace up town committed by a party of Italian stonemasons.

A number of the disturbers were arrested, and when they were searched by the police, it was found that several of the whole of them were armed with stiletto, pistol, or other dangerous concealed weapons.

None of the armed men under arrest had used his stiletto or pistol in the disturbance; but it is to be inferred that the weapons were carried "with intent to use."

We have already explained for the benefit of those who need the information, that it is unlawful for any resident of this State to go armed without a permit.

It must be enforced impartially against offenders, whether they be Italians, or Americans, or natives of any other country, whether they be citizens or aliens.

The men now under arrest from whom stiletto or pistols were taken should be instructed by the courts that it is against the law to carry arms here, unless it is specially permitted by the authorities.
