A New Method of Assassination.

The attempt of a murderous scoundrel to blow up Mr. RUSSELL SAGE with dynamite yesterday reveals a new danger to which our present society is subject.

The wild Anarchists gloried over the invention of this terrible explosive as affording them a means of destruction so powerful that it would offset their weakness in numbers.

France—Catholicism and Republicanism. So untoward has been the effect of recent incidents on the Pope's attempt to reconcile French Catholics to the republican régime.

The horrible incident shows also that men will need to surround themselves with new and further safeguards unless society sets to work deliberately and with thoroughness to exterminate this murderous breed.

Mr. Hill's Manifesto.

The speech which Governor HILL delivered yesterday at Elmira is read in Washington to-day before the meeting of the Democratic caucus to name the speaker.

With the boldness of political genius Governor HILL pushes directly to the front the very issue which Mr. MILLS and his Mugwump backers, and Mr. CLEVELAND and his Mugwump friends, are doing their utmost to evade and suppress until after the next Presidential election.

More than this, the Governor proceeds with the clearness and precision of a master of the art of expression to show that the Mugwump assumption that there is no common ground for the Democrats of the East and West and South to take as against the Republican position on silver coinage is the wildest postulate of folly.

It is within bounds to affirm that no document since Mr. CLEVELAND's tariff message of 1887, inviting the Democracy to disaster, has been so deeply freighted with political consequences as this speech in which Governor HILL, on the eve of his departure

from Albany to Washington, shows the Democracy how disaster can be retrieved, and victory won.

Trouble With the Side Judges.

In Jersey City the Court of General Sessions is held by three Judges. The presiding Judge is a lawyer and his associates are laymen.

This lately was due not to Judge LITVINCOFF, who presided, but to the fact that his lay associates would not consent to impose the severer penalty which he favored.

In this State there were formerly side Justices in the Court of Oyer and Terminer, over which a Justice of the Supreme Court always presided.

The side Justices are still retained in this State, however, in the Court of Sessions in every county except in the city and county of New York; and they cannot be entirely removed from the State Constitution.
