

LAYING PLANS FOR CANOING.

The place must be so exposed as to present a reasonable view of the water, and steady winds for the holding of the paddling races and boating of canoes, good facilities for obtaining food ready and cheap means of transportation, and a suitable shore of ground to properly set out headquarters on a commanding point, with ladies' camp on the shore, and a point like the hill thoroughly. Where the camp is to be located is a narrow strip of ground extending out six miles into the lake, on the extreme end of which rises a steep bluff, on the top of which will be situated a magnificent view of the sailing races.
