



Later developments in the case of the mysterious disappearance of Otis Greys, the Southern investment promoter, who took passage for Fall River on the Pilgrim and was not seen after he entered his stateroom, throw considerable doubt on the theory first assumed, that he walked off the steanboat in his sleep.

Mr. Greys was never seen in this city dressed otherwise than in fashionable clothes of good material. The only suit of clothes found in his stateroom was an old and rather shabby suit of dark blue.

"I do not recollect ever having seen Mr. Greys in a dark suit. I am certain he never wore any of his frequent visits to my office in that style. His clothes were always new and fashionable, and as I remember, light in color."
