

THE FIGHT IN NEBRASKA.

A LIVELY STRUGGLE FOR PADDUCK'S SEAT IN THE SENATE.

The Republicans Need Five Votes to Win on Joint Ballot - Fusion Between the Democrats and Independents Would be Easy if It Were Not for the Factional Democratic Quarrel - The Supreme Court Decision, However, Paves the Way for Combination and Republican Defeat.

IRVING, Neb., Dec. 25.—A successor to United States Senator A. S. Paddock will be elected by a Legislature which will assemble in this city in biennial session Jan. 3, and the contest for the place will be interesting and unique. There have been lively contests for the Senate since the Reconstruction era, but never within the Republican party.

In the late campaign the Republicans elected three candidates for State offices and succeeded in wiping out the Independent majority in the Legislature, but they did not themselves obtain a majority in the law-making body, and whether the next Legislature from Nebraska will be a Republican, Democrat, or Independent is a question which is just now engaging the attention of the State's most astute politicians.

Gov. James L. Boyd and Tobo Castor, member of the Democratic National Committee, and the Democratic State Central Committee have assured Mr. Cleveland and other Eastern Democrats that if elected to the present term of the election of a Republican Senator, and for the last month the Democratic leaders in this State have addressed themselves to the task of forming a fusion with the Independents for the purpose of making good their promises.

A number of conferences have been held and meetings held, but the fusion has not been made. It is almost constantly in close consultation in this city. The overtures which have been made to the Independents have been favorably received, and it would be comparatively easy to bring the two parties together for one thing, factional strife in the Democratic party.

AN INFERNAL MACHINE AT THE DUBLIN DETECTIVE OFFICE.
