APHIDES IN OUR FRUIT TREES.

Unless Attacked in Time They May Ruin the Entire Fruit Crop in the State.

ALBANY, May 20.—State Entomologist Lintner said to THE SUN reporter yesterday:

"Not since the year 1889 has the spring opened with such abundance of plant lice on the fruit trees of the State.

It is a memorable one among entomologists for the remarkable multiplication of plant lice in orchards, fields, and gardens.

Particularly was it also noticeable in the commercial world, because the great damage done to the hop vines of the Empire State resulted in a record loss of the crop.

The present year threatens to be equally as disastrous. Reports from all over the State show that the aphid infestation is spreading rapidly. It is estimated that the loss of the crop of this season would be \$10,000,000.
