THE BEHING SEA CASE. Very Different Decisions Which the Condemned Parties Await from the Court.

June 12.—Sir Charles Russell, Sir Richard Webster and the other counsel representing Great Britain before the International Tribunal of Arbitration, today asked the tribunal to find that the searches and seizures in Behring Sea, mentioned in the British schedule, whether of ships or goods, and the arrests of masters and crews, were made by authority of the United States; next, that the searches and seizures were made in non-territorial waters, for alleged breaches of United States municipal laws committed on the high seas; and further, that said searches and seizures, imprisonment of masters and crews, and the fines imposed upon them, were made, inflicted or imposed under any claim of right of jurisdiction, except as it has been submitted to the decision of the arbitrators.

MR. SEXTON WONT RESIGN. The Conference of the Irish Leaders Settled.

LONDON, June 12.—The conference of the Irish members of Parliament was resumed today. The principal matter under discussion was the retirement from Parliament of Mr. Thomas Sexton, who was elected as the member for North Kerry, and who withdrew from the House of Commons in consequence of the differences that have arisen regarding the management of the Freeman's Journal, the organ of the Anti-Parnell section of the Irish Parliamentary party.

ANTI-HOME RULE MEETING. Lord Salisbury Drops Into M. Laphor to Show What Cause is Doing.

LONDON, June 12.—The first of the series of meetings designed by the Unionists to rouse all London against home rule, was held in the Royal Surrey Theatre this evening. The Marquis of Salisbury was the most notable speaker. He illustrated his opinion of Mr. Gladstone's action toward Ireland with an elaborate metaphor based on the account of the recent disaster in Washington. The Premier, he said, was digging a cellar under the ancient fabric of the empire. He was working unceasingly, as did the men under the old throne in Washington. If he should be allowed to dig his way to the bottom of the empire, the result would be a complete and final ruin.

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BRIGGS MEN WILL NOT DOWN THE PRESBYTERY NOT DISPOSED TO ACCEPT THE ASSEMBLY'S DECISION.

Free-Willers Propose to Refer Entering the Judicial Process to the Presbytery and Memorialize the Next Assembly-Action is Postponed After a Heated Debate.

Yesterday's session of the Presbytery was tumultuous and bitter. Hisses abounded; angry words were spoken. Two and three ministers were on their feet at the same time, claiming the floor and speaking at once and refusing to yield to the Moderator.

Dr. William Harshaw presided, and for a time nothing of special interest occurred. Then Prof. Francis Drown of Union Seminary rose and said: "A communication has been received from the General Assembly and an action has been proposed in reference to it. I desire most carefully to avoid manifestation of personal feeling. The Presbytery was getting today, and Dr. Brown said he had a motion to make and wished to precede the motion by some remarks. He was asked whether Dr. Brown could make a speech before he made his motion. The Moderator decided that Dr. Brown was out of order.
