TRAVEL TO THE WORLD'S FAIR.

An Increase in September of 25,000 Passengers Over the Same Month Last Year.

In fact experienced travelers are securing their berths on the Pullman and Pullman Palace cars weeks in advance of the date of their intended use.

U.S. Navy's New Cruiser Olympia Ready for Trial.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 5.—One of the finest protected cruisers ever constructed in the country will have her official trial this month. To-day Irving Scott, President of the Union Iron Works of San Francisco, reported to Secretary Herbert that the Olympia is completed and ready for trial. The trial will be held at the yard of the Union Iron Works at San Francisco. The Olympia has a displacement of about 5,600 tons, and is fully 1,000 tons larger than the Baltimore, the largest cruiser now in the navy. She is expected to make twenty knots an hour, and to have a maximum speed of sixteen knots. She is intended for a flagship, and will be assigned to the Pacific station on this duty.
