

FITZ LANDS A FATAL BLOW

CON RIORIAN, WHO RECEIVED IT, DIED SOON AFTERWARD.

STRAUCH, N. Y., Nov. 17.—At Jacob's Opera House last evening the exhibition bout between Robert Fitzsimmons and Con Riorian, his sparring partner, the latter was struck by Fitzsimmons, and the result of the blow was death. Riorian, it is claimed, had been drinking heavily, and gave evidence of his condition as he walked onto the stage, but despite this he was allowed to enter the ring.

There are differences of opinion as to the force of the blow, but it was sufficient, for Riorian reeled and fell to his knees. Then he fell over like a dead man.

The audience was worked up to a fury of excitement. Boys and men stood up in their seats and shouted. Back in the wings the unconscious man lay in his ring costume with two physicians vainly endeavoring to bring him back to life.

It was not until 8:30 o'clock this morning, after 8 o'clock he began to sink rapidly, respiration growing fainter every minute, until finally, with a few spasmodic convulsions, he died.
