THE BAKING AFFAIR. The Relations of Our Country to the Alleged Torture of the Japanese Refugees. WASHINGTON, Nov. 28.—Secretary Gresham has at last had a chance to show how he manages matters relating to the question of diplomatic asylum for refugees in foreign lands. He has now furnished his object lesson, and the result is a rumor of Finnish tortures perpetrated upon the two Japanese youth who surrendered most reluctantly by Consul Gresham to the Chinese authorities, for trial as spies under the direct orders of Mr. Gresham. The story itself reached here long ago. It brought out a denial, gravely based, it would appear, on the assertion of the Chinese Minister that extradition by torture is unlawful in China, and hence could not have occurred.
