

SHOT DEAD BY A TRAMP.

OFFICER JEWELL OF RAILWAY KILLED IN MAKING A RAID.

His Stinger, Who Carried Burglar's Tools and Dynamite, Had Fired Tramp at Another Officer and Had Missed Him, and It Was a Random Shot that Hit Jewell.

Special Policeman Alfred E. Jewell of Railway was shot in the abdomen and instantly killed by John Sloan, a burglar, yesterday afternoon. Sloan was in the East River when he shot Jewell.

Jewell is also an inspector for the Railway Gas Company. He was in the East end of the town when the chief's call reached him, and on his way down the railroad track he arrested John Kelly, a companion of the man who was shot.

Chief Wright caught Kelly and turned him over to Dunham, who had John Kelly, Avers and he then started to follow them.

Jewell was about fifty-eight years old. He was married and had two children, a son and one daughter. He was a veteran of the civil war.
