

SUICIDE OF A POLICEMAN.

KLIN DIMISHED THE FORCE WHEN KNOWN TO BE DEAD.

Over Thirty Complaints Made Against Him Had Been Made, but His Resignation Was Not Accepted. Two Other Suicides.

Police Officer Peter J. Klein, 39 years old, who four weeks ago was attached to the East Sixty-seventh street police station, committed suicide early yesterday morning at his home at 286 East Tenth street by shooting himself through the head.

Since his appointment on Feb. 12, 1885, to the police force Klein has been a hard drinker, and his record as a policeman was exceptionally bad. Over thirty complaints had been made against him. A few weeks ago, while supposed to be on duty, he was caught in the rear of a saloon at Seventy-fifth street and Lexington avenue. Roundsman Woods reported the matter to the East Sixty-seventh street station house.

The Police Commissioners refused to accept it and charges of being in a saloon and falling to report for duty were preferred against the policeman. He did not appear at his trial, and his name was struck from the roll of the police force.
