KEEPEE A PLOT TO ESCAPE.

Keoper Patterson Frustrates the Plans of Three Convicts at Trenton.

TRENTON, Nov. 26.—Keeper John H. Patterson of the New Jersey State Prison yesterday disclosed the plot of a number of prisoners to escape, and as a consequence three of the plotters, William Speer, John Langenberg, and William C. Housell, are confined in the dungeons on bread and water diet, and an investigation is being made to learn what connection other prisoners had with the plot.

Speer and Langenberg were sentenced from Morris county in February, 1914, to ten years each for breaking and entering, and Housell was sentenced from Middlesex county in June, 1912, to fifteen years for burglary.

Their plan was to escape on the first foggy morning, when they would wear leas of being arrested by the guards on the towers and walls.
