They Begin Their Journey in Madison Square Garden.

A fair-sized crowd gathered in Madison Square Garden last night to see the start of the six days' bicycle race for women.

There are twenty contestants, and they are divided into four squads, although two of ten riders each started at midnight.

Bayne's Sixty-ninth Regiment band gave a concert, beginning at 9 o'clock last night, and from that time until midnight the spectators were entertained by music.
