MOVING A GIANT BOILER. It Took 24 Horses and Cost \$1,000 to Bring It Here from Jersey City.

When the big Climax boiler was set up at the World's Fair it was an object of even greater wonder and admiration than was the Corlies engine at the Centennial Exhibition.

The boiler was built for the New York Steam Company by the Erie Iron Works Company, Limited, of Warren, Penn. It took six months to complete it and it cost \$12,000.

The largest in the world, and machinists declared that it would be many a day before a larger one would be built.

The boiler was shipped from Warren to Jersey City over the Pennsylvania Railroad on a car used in transporting the heaviest guns.

It weighed 119,000 pounds, and has a capacity of 1,000 cubic feet.

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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
