


TIED HIM TO A LAMP POST.

ENGLWOOD, Aug. 23.—Mrs. William W. Green, who was fined \$5 last week by Recorder Fellows on a charge of coasting down Palisades avenue on her bicycle, is very indignant, and so are her friends. On her trial she denied that she had coasted, and she sent a letter to a local newspaper, in which she said: "I desire to enter my most emphatic protest against the unwarrantable charge brought against me of breaking the city ordinance in regard to coasting. I utterly deny the charge, and as the matter seems to resolve itself into a question of rectitude, I consider the value of my word quite equal to that of any new-fledged policeman whose sense of importance far exceeds any idea of discretion or discrimination. The policeman and the men with him were wholly wrong in their statements. Unless they are provided with eyes more than ordinary keen, it is absurd to utter a word which they could look clear through a bicycle and see the position of a rider's foot on the other side. It is also most extraordinary that no notice was taken at the time of this alleged enormous offense against the laws of this august but infatigable city."
