SALISBURY'S PROGRAMME.

INDICATIONS THAT THE IRISH WILL INTERFERE WITH IT.

LONDON, Jan. 9.—Before Parliament opens three Cabinet councils will be held. The first meeting will be devoted to settling the details of the work of the session. At the second meeting, which it is expected will be summoned for Jan. 14, the Queen's speech opening the session will be prepared, and at the third meeting the general line to be taken by the Ministers on the debate in reply to the Queen's speech will be decided upon.

The most important of a series of amendments to the address will directly challenge the Government on the Irish financial reform question. Mr. John Dillon and Mr. John Redmond will each offer an amendment, but the Government will have to face a much more formidable opposition than the leaders of the two sections of the Irish Parliamentary party. The Irish Unionists, led by Col. Sanderson, member for North Armagh, propose to attack the Government on the taxation question, and if the pending arrangements are carried out, Col. Sanderson will move an amendment, which will be seconded by either Mr. Dillon or Mr. Timothy Healy, showing the strange political bewilderment that has been made by the taxation agitation.

The debate on the address is expected to last over a night, and the next day, the 11th, the Ministers will be asked to explain the Government's policy. It is anticipated, but it is feared there will be such a depletion of the Unionist majority as to render the Government's position precarious. The Nationalist-Unionist coalition grows in strength through the Government's delay in dealing with the Irish members of all political faiths fall to be disappointed. The Government's policy is to be the appointment of a commission which can make the whole session a campaign of obstructive operations, which would leave the Government in a position to be able to deal with the situation.
