

WOMAN AND THE BICYCLE.

LONG-SKIRTED, BEDRAGGLED ONES AT MRS. HEDDERS' LECTURE.

Yesterday was cycle day with the Brooklyn Health Culture Club. The members met in the ballroom of the Hotel St. George and talked wheeling for three hours.

A request that all members who could do so should appear in cycling costume was complied with by only four or five women.

"And if I could look like that," said a tall, gaunt sister in another corner, "there aren't enough sisters in Greater New York to keep me out of the saddle."

"There is no such thing as age when it comes to bicycling," said the speaker. "The women here are all women—old, young, fat, thin, tall, short, stout, and plump."

"When I first said that I would speak on cycling to the women of this city," said the speaker, "I don't see what you can say. You just got on a wheel and ride, and that settles it."

"A great deal depends on first instruction," said the speaker. "If you are not properly instructed, you will not only not enjoy it, but you will be injured."

"The first important question to consider is the selection of a wheel," said the speaker. "When we consider that one who is riding a bicycle is subject to many accidents, it is not surprising that many women are afraid to get on a wheel."

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GRAY THROUGHBREDS.

Belmar the Only Worthy Horse of the Color Racing in This Section.

That gray horses have proved failures as sires is a stud book record. This has been due in a measure to general prejudice against the color, and to a lack of opportunity.

Belmar, Thunder disappeared into Canada. Gray Eagle, however, sired a fair chance, and he failed to perpetuate his name, while no excuse on the score of lack of appreciation can be raised on Lightning's behalf, who, during his career as a sire, was responsible for Jean Valisen.

PART OF RIVERSIDE DRIVE HANDED OVER TO THEM.

The Privileges Heretofore Enjoyed by Pedestrians Encroached Upon—President McMillan Said to Have Authorized the Innovation, Which is Not Cheerfully Received by All.

Orders were given to Superintendent of Parks Parson about two months ago to turn over to the use of bicyclists a section of Riverside Drive between 102d and 122d streets, thereby depriving thousands of pedestrians of rights they have enjoyed since the drive was opened.

Before the fight between Corbett and Fitzsimmons free-hand hitting was completely ignored by principals and referees. 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WING SHOTS' CARNIVAL.

HUGE ENTRY IN THE GRAND AMERICAN HANDICAP AT ELKWOOD.

At the end of the twenty-first round Mr. W. F. Carver, Henry Sec, and T. A. Marshall leave off with straight scores—Fast Birds and a Wind Storm Puzzle the Experts.

The Grand American Handicap was shot at Elkwood Park, N. J., yesterday, and brought out a field of 135 of the best wing shots in the country. Owing to a terrific rain squall in the afternoon, combined with the unheard-of entry list, it was impossible to finish the event last night, but, unless something unforeseen happens, the last rounds will be shot to-day.

In spite of the enormous number of shooters, only three men were in the lead at the end of the twenty-first round, while fourteen men had missed one bird. As there are twenty-six moneys in the event, it means that the men with two misses will have a chance to shoot up, which seems surprising in view of the large number of contestants.

The exact purpose for which this division of the drive was originally intended is not clearly connected with the Park Department seems to have been a driveway for vehicles going north.

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
