CANADA AND THE DINGLEY BILL.

Threats of Measures of Retaliation Which Would Hurt Canada More Than Us.

MONTREAL, April 3.—The imperialist papers are greatly excited with the idea that they have discovered a method of securing a newly framed American tariff bill at defiance, and bringing the United States to their knees. They call it the "manly policy." It consists in Canada's putting heavy export duties on articles on which the new tariff places higher import duties than are now levied, and it carried out would amount to a declaration of non-interference in the end of a general war of reprisals. As the articles that Canada exports to the United States are those for which she cannot readily find a substitute market, the manly policy would result in depriving many thousands of men of their living and sending them to swell the flood of emigrants going south over the border.

CONGRESS AND THE ARMY.

An Effort May Be Made to Pass the Line Reorganization Bill.

WASHINGTON, April 3.—Whether Congress, at the present session, will find time, in the intervals of discussing the tariff bill, for general legislation, outside of the four great reorganization bills, seems a little uncertain. If it should, the army could put in a strong claim for attention, and several bills relating to it have already been introduced.

Prominent among them is the Lamont bill for line reorganization. This measure adds two companies to the artillery and two companies to each regiment of infantry. Two principal arguments are relied upon for forcing this measure. One is that the new troops are now going up so fast and the heavy guns for them are coming forward in such numbers that it is prudent, even taxing into consideration only the question of proper care for the new batteries, to provide more artillerymen. In addition, there is the need of more men to work the guns, and these should be instructed as soon as possible in their duties. As to the infantry, it desires the three-battalion organization, while the experience of four years ago, in which the Government had to call on its troops for the enforcement of Federal laws, suggests that the army ought not to remain at its strength of over twenty years ago, when the constitution of the country was being established.

Another measure of interest is Mr. Hawley's, to promote the efficiency of the militia. This section has long been a bill to determine the lineal rank of medical officers entering a law army, and also the bill to simplify the regulations on which the army is organized, but failed through not being signed by President Cleveland. The bill for the reorganization of the militia is also of interest. Mr. Grosvenor's bill to make the Civilian Conservation Corps a national park for the military maneuver of the regulars and the organized militia should also be mentioned.

A bill which has an interest beyond the army is one to establish a bureau of military education, in charge of an army officer, and to promote the adoption of uniform military drill in the public schools of the country. The measure designed to increase the pay of non-commissioned officers of the army has heretofore been earnestly urged. ELEVATING BRICKS AND MORTAR.

Quick Work with Modern Hoisting Machines—How the Work is Done.

For some years now hoisting has been a business by itself. The hod carrier still carries mortar and bricks up a ladder as far as the first story, but after that, as a general thing, a hoisting machine is put in, carrying loads held in a rack, or, oftener, wheelbarrows, with material. The work has been reduced to a science, and some of the elevators run so fast that they would take the mortar's breath away if it had any.

Here was a modern hoisting plant at work in a big building under construction, that had a large open space for light and air in the center; a hoisting engine, equipped to run two elevators, was placed on the ground at the bottom of this open space. On one side of the space there was an elevator with a platform that would hold two wheelbarrows, 90 x a side at right angles with the first was an elevator with two small platforms, each holding a single barrow, and so rigged that when one went up the other came down, the platform coming down with empty barrow making a counterweight for the platform with full barrow going up, and so less power was needed to hoist the full one. From the engine a wire rope ran to each of the two elevators, one at the front, the other at the side. The two-barrow elevator ran from the first floor of the building, the compensating platform from the cellar.

On all such elevator platforms a strip is fastened along the edge on the side opposite that where the barrows are rolled on. This is the wheelbarrow's shaft not rolled off for the elevators are simply open platforms—and with the wheel against this strip the handles are within the edge on the other side, and so will clear everything as the elevator rises. In this case two men on the first floor rolled two wheelbarrows loaded with brick, the other with mortar, on to the two-barrow elevator, where they stood side by side. One of the men pulled a wire, the counter weight on the engine. The engine started the engine, and up went the elevator to the floor where the material was required. Men there rolled off the barrows, and rolled onto the elevator empty ones. The elevator was lowered, and it was going down the mortar barrow, and the loaded barrow to wherever the material was required, emptied them, and came back to the elevator, up with full barrow again. For while they had been going and coming the elevator had been lowered to the first floor, the men there had rolled off the empty barrow, and rolled on full ones, which they had filled while the elevator was going up, and so the elevator was kept going all day long, up and down, walking away from the elevator with empty barrows and bringing back empty ones.

The two-barrow elevator bars is one of moderate speed. The single-barrow compensator is a quick one. A man sits on a barrow in the cellar, pulls a bell, the engine puffs, and away goes the little elevator, like a streak, up and down, while down into view comes the other elevator with the empty barrow upon it. While the man above is rolling off the loaded barrow the man below is rolling on the empty while the man above is rolling on an empty the man below is rolling on a loaded barrow.
