In the proceedings by the Attorney-General to examine the Presidents of the coal companies under the provisions of the Anti-Trust acts, David Wilcox, counsel for Robert M. Oppant, the President of the Delaware and Hudson Canal Company, filed with Judge Chester, at Albany, yesterday, his brief in support of the motion to vacate the order for examination of the witnesses, in its completed form.

Speaking of the matter, Mr. Wilcox said yesterday that he felt from the above facts warranting the order, the subject upon which the proceedings were based, as applied to radical constitutional objections. In a penal action it seeks to subject the citizen to a practically unlimited examination by the Attorney-General into his private affairs.




