


MULBERRY BEND PARK.

PHILADELPHIA, June 15.—Francis W. Kennedy, who was sentenced in the United States Court on Sept. 15, 1891, to ten years' imprisonment for conspiracy to wreck the Spring Garden National Bank, of which he was President, was released from the penitentiary today. In February his sentence was commuted to seven years, and with the additional commutation granted by law, his actual term was reduced to nine months. His family are living in the West, and he has no plans for the future.
