

DEBS RALLIES STRIKERS.

THE CHICAGO AGITATOR WORKS IN THE WEST VIRGINIA FIELD.

Probably One-Third of the Diggers in That Region Have Gone Out and the Operators Fear a General Break at Once—Pennsylvania Men Brought by Marching Strikers.

WHEELING, W. Va., July 19.—Developments of this afternoon and evening in the mining districts of West Virginia warrant the assumption that the strike of the coal diggers, which began with such a rush this morning, will extend within a few hours to most of the competitive mines of the State.

This afternoon Debs spoke to 800 miners at West Freese, and evening in the chief Monongah mine. His remarks were received with a show of enthusiasm. He called upon the men to organize and after the meeting they held a secret conference in the schoolhouse near there.

The operators seem to have lost all hope of inducing their men to remain at work, and some of them acknowledge that the indications point to a general suspension of work in the Monongah district. The men refused to discuss plans, but it is known that they will depend upon the small mines in the valley to-morrow.

The situation in the southern part of the State without material change. The fact that one of the men who led on Saturday to strike returned to work has disappointed the agitators. Renewed efforts will be made to get them out, and there is some talk of asking Debs's assistance.

THE RULE OF GOLD.

WASHINGTON, July 19.—One of the richest men in the United States Senate is Senator Turner of Spokane, Wash. He is elected last February by Populists, succeeding William C. Squire, who had been one of Washington's representatives in the Senate since the Territory was admitted to Statehood.

It was only after a prolonged contest that Judge Turner was elected, and when he took his seat there was no great amount of enthusiasm manifested by the people of Washington.


