PASSED AWAY AT HIS SUMMER HOME IN RHODE ISLAND.

AS A RESULT OF HIS SUMMER HOME IN RHODE ISLAND. COL. GEORGE BLISS OF NEW YORK DIED AT HIS COUNTRY PLACE IN WAKEFIELD YESTERDAY MORNING.

George Bliss was tall and vigorous, his eyes were piercing, his nose large and prominent, and his head was surmounted by a bushy growth of curly hair which had turned nearly white many years ago and gave him the name of the "white haired boy."

Bliss was a member of the State Board of Health appointed to investigate complaints made against Barron Island oysters.

Neck's affidavit was made yesterday, and the report of the coroner's jury, which was made public yesterday, stated that the bodies of infants at her rooms, at 470 Ninth avenue, simultaneously with publication of affidavit a report was circulated that Mrs. Neck, by advice of her friends, intended to plead guilty to murder in the second degree and turn State's evidence against Thack to escape execution.
