

OFFICIAL HOLIDAYS OVER. PRESIDENT AND CABINET GETTING READY FOR CONGRESS.

Major McKinley May Not Go to Ohio to Vote—Importance Attached to the President's First Annual Message. The Times Likely to Be Convinced of McKinley's Position.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 9.—The McKinley Administration has returned to town for the winter season of work and social functions. From now until Congress meets, on the first Monday in December, the Government workshops, including the Executive Mansion, will be closed.

To a colleague who waited upon him a few days ago to invite him to attend a country fair, President McKinley said that he must decline with regret, as he had returned to Washington with the determination not to leave it again for some time to come.

There is, perhaps, no precedent for starting the President out on a stump speaking tour, and it is possible, especially here in New York, that he will be regarded as undignified to appear on the stump in an election campaign.
