

CALIFORNIA GOLD OUTPUT.

IT IS SAID TO BE \$18,817,876 FOR LAST YEAR.

A Nevada Miner Strikes a Rich Pocket—A Huge Amount of Supplies Going Into Nevada—A Rich Ledge Discovered Near Truckee—Lucky Gold Find of a Month Ago.

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 8.—An estimate of the gold taken from the mines in California during the year just closed here, exclusive of the placer gold derived from it, places the total amount at about \$70,000,000 and \$100,000,000. For a number of years the gold has yielded about one-fifth of the State's annual gold product, while its entire yield has been produced by a quarter and a third of the quantity of the mine.

BRIDGE TROLLEY CAR SERVICE.

Work of Widening the South Roadway Delayed the Extension.

The extension in the bridge trolley service promised for yesterday did not materialize, as the widening of the south roadway at this end of the bridge had not been completed.

The cars of the Flushing and Graham avenue line crossed the bridge regularly on eight minutes' heads.

On week days these cars run on five-minute headway during rush hours. Trial trips have been made with De Kalb avenue cars.

By the end of the week it is thought the work will be completed and that all four loops will be put in use and cars of all lines run over the bridge.

An electric switch tower will be put in to shift the cars to the four loops as they reach the terminal. Each line will be assigned to a certain loop, on which its cars will regularly make the turn from the north to the south roadway.
