ARKELL COMPANIES FAIL.

Liabilities of the Arkell Publishing Company. Pat at \$1,100,000, of which \$600,000 is in Notes and Open Accounts—The Banks and Individuals That Are Creditors.

The Arkell Publishing Company, at 110 Fifth Avenue, which publishes Judge, Frank Leslie's Illustrated Weekly, and the Sun, and the Judge Publishing Company, at the same address, have gone into the hands of receivers on account of financial difficulties.

The receiver was precipitated by the protest of a note of the company for \$5,000, due on June 1. The company had only \$25,000 on hand to meet it, and could not realize on its assets.

The next day the directors decided that it was best for all interests that the company should be dissolved and a receiver appointed. William J. Arkell, President of the company, stated in his affidavit that the assets of the company are \$1,100,000, and that bonds of \$500,000 have been issued, secured by a mortgage on all the company's property...

The fate of the actress who on Saturday committed suicide by asphyxiation is of a kind with many other tragedies in which the lives of stage people have come to an end. She had secured a room in the Hotel Hamilton, at 110th Street, and only a few days before her death her readings were described and freely illustrated in a daily newspaper.
