QUANTRELL'S LOST BOOTY.

People Still Searching for It in the Mound in Missouri. The Guerrilla Said to Have Left It There During His Flight After the Raid on Lawrence, Kan., in 1858.

JOHNS, Mo., March 25.—It is believed by people living in this region that a large part of the booty taken by Quantrell and his raiders from Lawrence, Kan., in September, 1858, now lies buried in a mound on the left bank of the river in Bates county, Mo. The mound is probably 150 feet high and the top is six or eight acres in extent. It is situated upon the farm now owned by Dr. H. A. Rhodes and his sister, Foster, Mo. At the time of the war the place was called the "Mound of the Guerrillas."

A member of Quantrell's band informed the writer that on the morning the party disbanded after the Lawrence raid Quantrell and certain of his lieutenants, Shepard, Tod, Upson and Anderson, went away in the direction of the mountains of the State and divided, and gave orders that no man should follow them on pain of death. On the retreat from Lawrence the first stand was made just at dark at Paola, Kan. The pursuing forces, after a long and hard fight, were repulsed.
