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WHAT CAUSES LOCKJAW.

A DEADLY GERM THAT IS OF WIDE DISTRIBUTION.

Contrary to the generally accepted notion, tetanus is not a local disease affecting the muscles of mastication, but an acute general disease in which the contraction of the muscles of the jaw, or "lockjaw," is only a comparatively insignificant symptom.

The most frequent type is what is known as the "acute traumatic," which follows marked wounds, usually of a lacerated nature, and especially if dirt or any substance which has been in contact with earth is allowed to enter the wound.

Rapidly following the prodromal symptoms the main features of the disease begin to present themselves. The patient complains of stiffness and a feeling of tension in the muscles of the neck and jaw, gradually increasing in intensity.
