

NOT DRUNK GOING TO BOSTON.

Prisoner Discharged Once, but Punished When Arrested a Second Time.

Tadwa More of Boston, who was arrested for intoxication on Friday last and discharged by Magistrate Zeller on a promise of returning home at once, was a prisoner again in the Jefferson Market Court yesterday, charged with the same offense. Police Officer Gilligan of the Market station found him early yesterday morning at Eighteenth street and Sixth avenue.

He said that he was John C. Morton, a hotel man of Boston, and that he would be questioned during the winter. Magistrate Zeller gave him a good talking over for having broken his promise, and fined him \$5, which he could not pay.

RAPID TRANSIT CONTRACT.

John O'Brien Thinks the Successful Bidder Will Submit It in Sections.

John D. Crimmins has gone to Boston, presumably on business connected with a bid for the contract for constructing the rapid transit tunnel. John O'Brien and John C. Sheehan, who it is expected will also bid for the contract, have both been out of town on the matter too, having visited Boston and Pittsburg. Mr. O'Brien said yesterday that he believed that whoever got the contract would immediately divide the work up into sections costing approximately \$1,000,000, and would receive twenty or thirty bids for each section. He said he thought the city was throwing away \$1,000,000 for \$12,000,000 by not making away a division of the contract itself.

This is the second notary public who has been fined for this offense. There are a dozen others who have been indicted. Judge Thomas said he hoped that the punishment meted out to Kaufmann would be a warning to other notaries.
